Notes from Session

Our May meeting was primarily spent discussing St. Andrew's proposed Bullying and Harassment Policy. In order to meet WorkSafe BC Standards, as an employer, St Andrew's church is required to have documented policies and procedures that outline how a complaint of bullying or harassment will be dealt with. The draft Workplace Bullying and Harassment Policy, reporting and investigating procedures were forwarded to Presbytery for its feedback regarding its role prior to finalizing the policy. When the report is finalized, we will share it with the congregation of St. Andrew's.

In early 2018, the Presbytery of Vancouver Island struck a committee consisting of the Reverend Doctor Gordon Kouwenberg - clerk of Presbytery, Mr. Roy Napier - moderator of Presbytery and the Rev. Laura Kavanagh - interim moderator of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, to appoint an interim minister to St. Andrew's. One of the qualifying credentials of the successful candidate was that the minister be experienced in interim ministry. The number of such ministers in Canada is limited and the committee started looking to the USA for possible candidates. The committee corresponded with the Reverend Mitchell Coggin, an interim minister and teacher of interim ministry of the Presbyterian Church USA, presently serving in Tennessee. The Reverend Coggin expressed interest and he was invited to Victoria by the committee for an interview and an opportunity to meet the available session members. Both the committee and session felt that the Reverend Coggin was indeed a good candidate. Since this is a very major move for the Coggins, Rev. Coggin requested that his wife, Linda, have an opportunity to visit Victoria. The Coggins were here May 22-24 and met with the heads of the major committees and toured Victoria. A two-year contract has been signed between the Reverend Coggin, the Presbytery of Vancouver Island and the Session of St. Andrew's Victoria with a tentative start date of July 15th.

We ask that the congregation pray for the swift completion of the steps required for immigration and that housing will be found for the Coggins family. Let us all give thanks for God's care was we look forward to the future as God's church in Victoria.

We do not need to take a course, we do not need specific training, we simply need to speak to God in our own voice and lift up our friends and fellow members to God. Won't you join us?

But the end result was a big accomplishment—not only did we sell a huge amount of leftover supplies, we were also supported by a large group of volunteers who all got to know each other a little bit better. Many of us were amazed at how much 'stuff' was lodged in that small craft

room downstairs.

On Friday evening, we had a line up of people wanting to be the first to scoop up fabrics, yarns, craft supplies and sewing machines. That evening, we sold almost \$600 worth of inventory—that's a lot of items worth twenty-five or fifty cents. Most of the items were under \$5. On Saturday we sold another \$500. In addition to the items for sale, there were also bins with free items as well as books and patterns sold by donation.

One buyer was thrilled to find a vintage hem pinner, another scooped up bags of quilting fabric as she had left her 'stash' back in Ontario. There were many interesting conversations about why they were buying the items.

We still have a lot left and will pack it up and take it to worthwhile charities.
